
English

As readers we will listen attentively to a range of stories that will help us learn all about ourselves.


We will read some gorgeous fiction books and very interesting non-fiction books all about the world around us. We will listen to and recite short poems ready to perform to our friends.


We will begin to learn letter sounds to help us read.


Autumn Term 2023

Topic: Around the World

Understanding The World

We will explore our school and the local community using maps to visit other classrooms and playgrounds and the older children will walk around the fairground.

We will find out about the wider world by looking at the similarities & differences between Hull and London. We will also think about different climates around the world and investigate freezing and melting.



Maths

As mathematicians we will be reciting numbers carefully, making sure they are in the right order. We will count lots of different types of objects when they are in a neat row and when they are all jumbled up!

We will practise sorting into two groups by colour, type, shape and size.

We will begin to compare numbers and use the right words to discuss what is the same and what is different between amounts.

Expressive Arts & Design / PE

We will look closely at our own features to help us draw and paint self-portraits by selecting different pens, crayons, paints & paint brushes. We will learn how to mix powder paints to achieve the right colour to represent our pictures.

We will become more aware of others when we are running, jumping and climbing. F2 pupils will develop their movement to music through cheerleading sessions.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

As friends we will learn the Paisley Golden Rules. We will learn to take turns, share and follow routines. In our Jigsaw lessons we will learn to think about the feelings of others.

Physical Development

As athletes we will:

Use counting to help stay in time with music

Express ideas through controlled movement

Copying, linking and repeating actions with control

Develop our vertical and horizontal marks

Develop scissor control along a line

As **Scientists** we will:

Name and identify the different weather and seasons and talk about similarities and differences in the weather

Personal, Social and Emotional

As class members we will:

Develop our understanding of emotions

Make friends with children and adults in our class

Show that we are using a good listening body when adults are speaking

Be able to talk about our likes and dislikes

Be aware of the class rules and understand the reason for these rules

Begin to adapt our behaviour to different events and social

situations

Communication and Language

As **communicators** we will:

Develop our ability to listen and follow instructions by playing lots of listening games

Develop the ability to sit in a circle and listen to others opinions and interests by only talking when holding Jigsaw Jeanie.

Be able to talk about our family, friends, likes and dislikes

Start to respond to instructions given by adults in class

Learn new vocabulary about our bodies, feelings, senses and religions
