

English

In English we will follow the Talk for Writing process to learn, explore and write different text types. Initially, we will be learning about warning and journey stories.

In Mrs Inchbold's class, we will be reading and analysing the texts *Proud to be Deaf* and *Max and the Millions* this term. Whilst in Mr Hulland's and Miss Hart's classes we will be reading *Nim's Island*. We will use these texts to develop reading fluency alongside other key comprehension skills such as predicting events, inferring feelings, summarising what has been read and retrieving information.

Art

As artists we will study Paul Cezanne's still life fruit paintings before experimenting with and learning about brush control, mark making, tints, shading and proportion. We will then apply our learning to a final piece of observational art.

Other Subjects

- In PE, our units are Basketball, Dance and Fundamentals.
- In RE, our unit is Belief in the Community.
- In computing, our unit is The Internet where we learn about networks and staying safe.
- In Music, our lessons are being taught by a teacher from the Albemarle Music Centre.
- In PSHE, our units are Being Me in my World and Celebrating Difference.

Design Technology

In design and technology, we will be learning what is meant by a smart wearable. The children will write a program to initiate a flashing panel. They will use materials to create a prototype and work together to create a design criteria based on the consumer. The children will use this criteria and their knowledge of smart wearables to make and then evaluate a pouch to house the LED panel.

Geography

In geography we will be studying key features of the UK before learning about settlements. We will then study our city and region in detail learning about human and physical geographical features. We will learn about the importance of ports focusing on the port of Hull.

History

In science lessons we will be studying animals including humans focusing on what they need to stay fit and healthy. We will look closely at food groups and nutrition as well as skeletons and muscles.

We will then continue to study humans and their digestive systems. Looking at how the digestive systems work and the different types of teeth we have aiming to understand their purposes.
