## **Marking and Feedback Policy**

**September 2024**

## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF MARKING AND FEEDBACK



1. To have a positive impact on the learning of all pupils
2. The intention is that Assessment for Learning (AfL) occurs in everyday lessons. AfL improves learning and raises standards. The way teachers mark and give feedback is central to the process.
3. To give praise and encouragement to all children, regardless of attainment and ability.
4. To contribute to the assessment of children's work and to help the teacher to gain information for future planning.
5. To provide a point of discussion with children and to provide an opportunity to respond to teachers' comments when appropriate.

## IMPLEMENTATION

- Children's work should be marked in one colour. In order to maintain consistency across the school, all teachers will mark in **green**.
- Maths work will be marked using a **green** tick, when correct, and a **green** dot when wrong. Where many mistakes occur, verbal feedback or a constructive written comment will be provided by the teacher rather than just a series of dots.
- Incorrect spelling will be identified along with teacher modelling of the correct spelling. Pupils will be given the opportunity to rewrite words correctly. Teachers must be mindful about the number and degree of difficulty of words identified for correction. If errors are identified by a teacher outside of lesson time, corrections must be made at the end of a piece of work and written 3 times by the pupil for KS2 pupils and written once by KS1 pupils.
- Incorrect punctuation will be corrected or highlighted as appropriate to the age and ability of the child. Not all errors will be corrected. The amount of corrections will depend upon the age and ability of the child and the purpose of the work.
- Children should be encouraged to look for mistakes. There are occasions for children to mark each others' work (Peer Assessment) and this is at the teacher's discretion. This should be monitored by the teacher.
- Whenever possible, work will be marked in the presence of the child, allowing the teacher to make clear the targets for future work, or to clarify misunderstandings.
- When appropriate and purposeful, teachers will write a command or question for the pupil to respond to the next time they use their book. This is to provide pupils with opportunities to address misconceptions, make corrections, further develop understanding and extend thinking.
- When marking independent final pieces of writing at the end of a Talk for Writing unit, teachers will provide at least one positive comment along with a developmental comment.
- Children should have the opportunity to read any written comments and respond appropriately.
- Children should use purple "polishing" pens when making corrections or responding to marking where possible.
